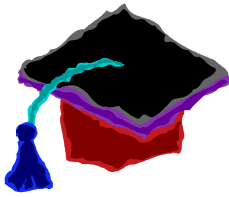

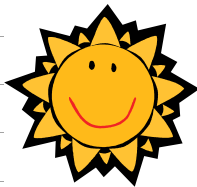
Yearbook
